*I give and dispose thereof as followeth Imprimis I will that my debts and funeral expenses shall be paid and discharged item*

*I give and bequeath to **FRANCES** als [**JOANNA TODD**] and to **HARRISON COLUMBINE** daughters of my brother **BENJAMIN COLUMBINE** and to each of them one shilling item*

*I give and bequeath to my brother **EDWARD COLUMBINE** one shilling item*

*I give and bequeath to my brother **VENTRIS COLUMBINE** one shilling item*

*I give and bequeath to my sister **SUSAN COLUMBINE** one shilling item*

*I give and bequeath to my sister **ELIZABETH DAVENPORT** one shilling item*

*I give and bequeath to my cousin **JOHN WILFORD** Bookseller of London a gold ring of the value of twenty shillings item*

*I give and bequeath to my cousin **ANNE WILFORD** of Enfield in the County of Middlesex aforesaid spinster a gold ring of the value of twenty shillings. All the rest and residue of my estate goods and chattels whatsoever I give and bequeath unto my well beloved wife **ELIZABETH COLUMBINE** whom I do hereby make and appoint full whole and sole executrix of this my last Will and Testament and I do hereby revoke disannul and make void all former Wills and testaments by me heretofore made either by words or in writing. In witness whereof I the said **THOMAS COLUMBINE** to this my last Will and testament (contained in one sheet of paper) Set my hand and seal the twentieth day of June in the year of Our Lord One thousand seven hundred and twenty nine. Signed sealed published and declared by the Testator in the presence of us whose names are subscribed as witnesses and attested by us in the presence of the said Testator.*
