

*I Lydia Goostrey* of the City of Bath in the county of Somerset spinster being of sound and disposing mind and memory and understanding praises be to God for the same do make publish and declare this to be my last Will and Testament in manner following that is to say first I will and direct that all my just debts funeral expenses and the charges of proving this my Will be paid and discharged by my executors hereinafter named. I give and bequeath unto **Barnard Dickenson** of {Monks?} in the county of Wilts Esquire and **George Burley** of London Gentleman all my personal estate and effects whatsoever and wheresoever and of what nature or kind so ever to hold to them the said **Barnard Dickenson** and **George Burley** their executors and admons and assigns upon the trust and to and for the end intents and purposes hereinafter by me mentioned and declared of and concerning the same that is to say to the end intent and purposes that my sister **Susannah Banks** shall and may have receive take and enjoy the said one annuity at yearly sum of thirty pounds of lawful money of Great Britain for and during the term of her natural life to and for her alone sole and separate use benefit and disposal independent of her present or any future husband who I will and declare shall have nothing to do therewith nor shall the same or any part thereof be subject or liable to his debts management intermeddling or control but that the receipt of my said sister **Susannah Banks** alone or an order and receipt pursuant thereto shall be from time to time a good and sufficient discharge to my said Trustees for what they shall so pay to her or her order by virtue and in pursuance of this my Will the same annuity or yearly sum of thirty pounds I will and direct shall be paid and payable to my said sister **Susannah Banks** on these two most usual feasts or days of payment in the year {that is to say} the twenty fifth day of March and the twenty ninth day of September by even and equal portions the first payment thereof to begin and be made on such of the said days of payment as shall first and next happen after my death and subject to the said annuity then as for and concerning all my said personal estate and effects in Trust to permit and suffer **Mary Western** the wife of **Reverend Charles Western** and her assigns to have receive take and enjoy the interests dividends and profits thereof for and during the term of her natural life to and for her own sole and separate use benefit and disposal independent of her present or any future husband who I will and declare shall have nothing to do therewith nor shall the same or any part thereof be subject or liable to his debts management intermeddling or control but that the receipt of the said **Mary Western** wife of the said **Charles Western** of Kingham in the county of Oxford or an order and receipt pursuant thereto shall be from time to time a good and sufficient discharge to my said Trustees for what they shall so pay to her or her order by virtue and my pursuance of this my Will and from and after the death of the said **Mary Western** then as to for and concerning all my said personal estate and effects In Trust {subject as aforesaid} for all and every the child and children of the said **Mary Western** lawfully begotten or to be so begotten that shall have to attain his or her age of Twenty One years or day of lawful marriage by their respective ages of Twenty One years or days of lawful marriage {which shall first happen} equally to be divided between or among them if more than one share and share alike as tenants in common and not as joint tenants and in case there shall be but one such child of the said **Mary Western** that shall live to attain his or her said age of twenty one years or day of lawful marriage as aforesaid there in Trust for such only child when and as he or she shall attain his or her said age of twenty one years or day of lawful marriage as aforesaid his or her executors administrators and assigns and in the case there shall be no such child or children of the said **Mary Western** that shall live to attain his or her said age of twenty one years or day of lawful marriage as aforesaid then subject as aforesaid In Trust for my own personal expectations his or her their executors administrators and assigns for ever and to for or upon no other Trust and intent or purpose whatsoever and do hereby constitute and appoint the said **Barnard Dickenson** and **George Burley** executors in trust of this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all former Wills by me made In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this thirteenth day of April in the year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and eighty seven **Lydia Goostrey** {her signature} Signed sealed published and declared by the above named testatrix as and for her
